

PRIMARY PROVISION

The Rowans became The Rowans AP Academy from 1st June 2017, under the newly formed Inspiring Change Multi-Academy Trust, set up by the Headteacher, Deputy Head and Business Manager.

We have now obtained permission to open a free alternative provision Primary school (The Beeches), which we hope will be built on the woodland next to The Rowans. The school will cater for primary pupils who are at risk of exclusion or who have been excluded. Pupils will attend for two to four terms before being reintegrated back to mainstream school.

We are really excited about the potential for this school and hope that by giving children the help that they need at primary age, we can prevent them from being excluded further down the line.

We will keep you informed regarding the progress of The Beeches.




